By binding calcium in the blood, citrate provides effective, localised anticoagulation within the dialysis circuit itself, reducing the need for systemic anticoagulation that can lead to complications in critically ill patients.

Dr. Arendse also shared that Melomed has launched and will soon begin using the latest PRISMAX continuous kidney replacement therapy machines, making Melomed the first in South Africa to implement this cutting-edge technology. This advanced system integrates seamlessly with

the regional Citrate Anticoagulation, enhancing our renal care unit's ability to provide CRRT using the most modern technology available worldwide.

The adoption of Citrate Anticoagulation at Melomed Renal Care signifies a leap forward for patient safety and therapy efficiency, offering extended, uninterrupted dialysis sessions and a reduced need for blood transfusions.
